St. Peter's Cemetery, West Avenue

It will soon be time for spring cleaning at the Cemetery. Live flowers should be placed in concrete urns at the side of the memorial stone. There is no in-ground planting allowed and the use of clay, plastic or wooden pot is not allowed. Live Shrubbery is not to exceed 18 inches and should be placed in a concrete urn at the side of the memorial stone. Live (Fresh) wreaths should be attached to the memorial stone by a proper holder. Flags are allowed Memorial Day through Labor Day. In the Shrine Section, urns are allowed on flush markers (memorial stone from Memorial Day through Labor Day, when urns must be removed by the lot owner. Any items left at the end of a season will be removed.
