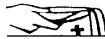

Christmas Shoebox Gifts for Starving Children in Haiti

Collection of shoeboxes will be October 2-3, 9-10 after all Masses at St. Mary's Church in Ballston Spa. Boxes can be left at St. Mary's school until the deadline of 10/17. Father Belanich, Director of Croation Relief Services in New Jersey, will ship boxes to Cardinal Stepanic's Orphanage and Children's Center, to other orphanages and for abandoned and street children in Haiti. On January 12, 2010, Haiti was hit with a 7.0 earthquake, killing 300,000 and leaving 1.5 million people homeless, with nothing but the clothes on their backs.

Shoeboxes can contain school supplies, non-perishable foods and other items, made in the USA only—no toys from China, no soaps, used items or clothes. A \$5.00 per box donation is asked for shipping to Haiti, placed outside of Christmas-wrapped box in separate envelope marked "shipping". Label your box with gender and age.
